## Another Step Taken in Program To Halt Sea Water Intrusion

Supervisor Burton W. Chace today announced approval by the Board of Supervisors of an engineering contract designed as another step in a long-range program to build a barrier against further sea water intrusion along an 11-mile stretch of the shoreline.

M. E. Salisbury, chief engineer of the County Flood Control District, was authorized to negotiate a pact with M. A. Nishkian and Co. of Long Beach.

It will call for the firm to provide district engineers with consulting services including studies, reports, subsurface investigation, surveying, soil reports, shop investigation, preparation of preliminary and final plans and technical specifications for construction of the second unit of water supply facilities for the West Coast Basin Barrier Project.

CHACE SAID the Nishkian Co. is now providing similar services for Unit I of the proposed barrier against further sea water intrusion along the west coast of the county.

He said that engaging a consultant is highly practical in that the district does not have the necessary specialized personnel to perform the major phases of this type of engineering work. Also, the program is intermittent and of relatively short duration making it inadvisable for the district to build up a staff to handle the work.

THE OVERALL project is vitally needed in an area running from Ballona Creek to the

Palos Verdes Hills because the intrusion of sea water into fresh supplies underlying the West Coast Basin has destroyed many of them and threatens destruction of others, Chace declared.

Broken into units, the program is expected to take about four or five years to complete. Unit 2 of the project consists of pipeline construction, a chlorination plant, a pressure regulating plant and other fixtures. Tentative cost of this unit is about \$450,000 with the entire project expected to involve an investment of approximately \$4.6 million.

Financing will be handled by the Flood Control District from its regular funds and Zone II monies, Supervisor Chace concluded.
