

TARTARS DROP CRUCIAL TILT, 12-7

Morningside Measures Spartans 32-13

Morningside scored in every quarter Friday as they measured the South High Spartans for a 32-13 defeat on the Inglewood gridiron.

Herb Hinsche, who was moved into a halfback slot to replace injured players, ripped

the Spartan defense wide open as he scooted to four touchdowns and added two conversions for emphasis.

The Monarchs hit early in the game, and traded sides at the end of the first quarter with a 12-0 lead.

The Spartans first hit the scoreboard late in the first half when Tom Roettger tossed a 21-yard pass to Ken Turner on the goal line for six points. The loss was South's fifth in a row.

Jerry Barber Joins Gardena Open Thursday

Fans with a penchant watching first class golf will congregate at Western Avenue this coming week for the eighth annual \$7,500 Gardena Valley Open 54-hole championship.

The four-day event, which begins Thursday, has lured a star-studded field headed by National PGA champion Jerry Barber of Wilshire C.C. in Los Angeles.

The 45-year-old Barber, proclaimed PGA Golfer of the Year, will be joined in the campaign for the top \$1000 purse by such able swingers as Jim Ferrier of Burbank, Smiley Quick of Downey, Eric Monti of Hillcrest C. C., and Charles Sifford of Los Angeles.

Australian-born Ferrier and Quick co-hold the tournament scoring mark of 196 which they made in winning the 1955 and 1956 event, respectively. They each were 17-under-par.

Also entered are Bob McCallister, 27-year-old Yorba Linda sensation; Duff Lawrence of Phoenix, the only amateur to ever win the California State Open title which he did in the summer, and Tommy Jacobs of Whittier.

The Gardena event, which has drawn a 300 player field, is being co-sponsored by the Gardena Kiwanis Club and L. A. County Department Parks and Recreation.

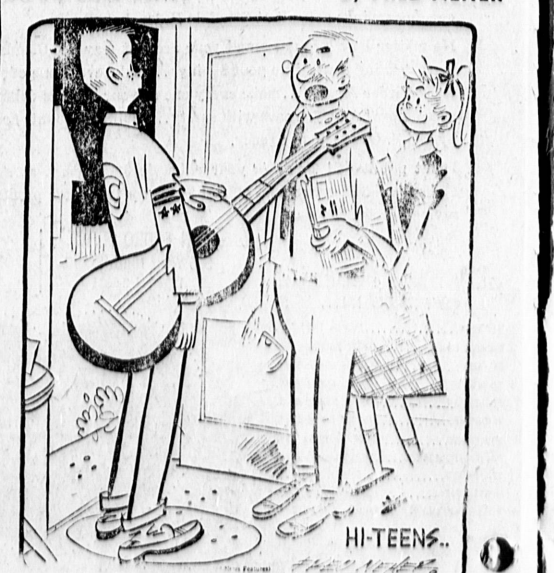

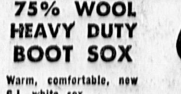
