

EC Harriers Nab Second At Mt. SAC

Vying against every top junior college cross country team in California, El Camino College swept to a second place in the 13th annual Mt. San Antonio College harrier event.

Santa Ana earned the meet title with 68 points to El Camino's 79. Cerritos finished third with 99 points and San Diego fourth with 109. (Low score wins.)

Rich Fernandez and Mike Thornton, former Torrance High track and cross country whiz, finished second and third respectively behind Santa Ana's Jim Conlay.

CONLAY SET a new record for the Mt. SAC course, running the 3.7 miles in 18:52.6. Fernandez, also under the old record of 19:03 set last year by Bakersfield's John Hutton, clocked 18:56.

Thornton finished the grueling race in 19:14, nine seconds ahead of the fourth place man.

ON THE novice division of the meet, the Warriors grabbed three of the first four places to walk away with a decisive victory. The Tribe scored 22 points to second place Mt. San Antonio's 53.

Gilbert Enriquez took first place for ECC in 20:38.8 while Doug Anderson, also from Camino, took second.

Third place went to Ray Van Asten from Mt. SAC, but ECC got back in the listings when Ron Jacobs swept into the fourth place slot.

Scorching Neil Keen of Pasadena and Sliding Al Gunter of Los Angeles, 1-2 dirt track motorcycle riders in the United States, carry their rivalry into the final week of the AMA season tomorrow night at Ascot Park, Gardena.

It's Championship Night, and racing director J. C. Agajanian has upped main event distance to 20-laps for the grand finale of the 32-week season.

Keen, Gunter and speed company receive competition from a different direction Friday night, what with a bevy of beauties vying in the finals of the "Miss Motorcycle of 1961" contest.

Charles McCabe to Join Herald Columns Sunday

Charles McCabe, whose column will start in the HERALD Sunday, writes a sports column that is really different. It isn't in the sports vernacular and it doesn't always appear on the sports page.

"The Fearless Sports Spectator" often appears opposite the editorial page, along with book reviews. As a matter of fact, McCabe disclaims being a sportswriter as such. He describes himself as "a writer who happens to write about sports."

MCCABE WAS born in New York City in 1915. He attended private schools and Manhattan College.

In 1936 he went to work for the New York American as police reporter. "I worked there until the paper folded under me — one year later," he said.

He went from there to the

cable desk of INS and from there, in 1939, to Puerto Rico where he served as publicity advisor to the government of Puerto Rico. He served under three governors: Winthrop Swope, Admiral Leahy.

FROM SAN JUAN he went back to the states where he worked for Steve Hannigan as publicity director for Sun Valley. When the war started he returned to San Juan as man-

aging editor of the English language newspaper, the Puerto Rico World Journal. At the same time he was a stringer for the Toronto Star and various other papers.

From there he became a war correspondent for UP covering the South Atlantic — as far south as Brazil — and the Caribbean. He won a commendation from the U.S. Navy as a result of his correspondent work.

NHS Meets San Pedro
