Free Diabetes Test to Be Given Tuesday

Free diabetes detection tests will be given Tuesday at the Torrance Health Center, 2300 Carson Ave., from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m.

The free tests are being given through a cooperative arrangement with the Los Angeles County Health Department and the Diabetes Assn. of Southern California.

While not conclusive, the simple urine test given will indicate whether or not additional investigation of the individual's condition should be done by a private physician.

According to Dr. K. H. Sutherland, county health officer, diabetes remains as the eighth leading cause of death in the United States despite the fact that the disease can be controlled through diet and proper medical care.

An estimated 54,000 persons in Los Angeles County have the disease and don't even know it, Dr. Sutherland said.
