Local Groups Slate Rallies on Saturday

Delegations of Torrance and Southwest residents will pay two visits to Hollywood Saturday, timing their visits to coincide with the scheduled visit of President Kennedy here on that day.

Leading off with a morning rally organized by screen personalities, the Women's Peace March volunteers, who presented petitions in Los Angeles recently, will be joined by a

newly formed group, HELP (Help Establish Lasting Peace), and will urge support of President Kennedy's program as outlined before the United Nations.

"THE PRESIDENT called for world security under law, disarmament with inspection, and the halting of nuclear testing," Mrs. Homer Wilson of Torrance said yesterday. Mrs.

Wilson is making bus reservations for Saturday morning's trip, and can be contacted at DA 6-1818.

Taking up the banners in the evening will be local Citizens for Freedom under the leadership of industrialist Jim Rea who will join with members of the National Indignation Convention of Dallas to express opposition to sending aid to Yugoslavia and countries in the Communist bloc.

SATURDAY night's rally is scheduled for 9 p.m. in front of the Hollywood Palladium where President Kennedy is scheduled to address a Democratic dinner. The rally will be the third this week for the group and is designed to cap rallies in Los Angeles on Tuesday and another in Log Beach at 7:30 this evening.

Principal target of the latter rallies is the shipment of American jet planes and atomic reactors to Tito's Yugoslavia.

Anti-Communism Rally Scheduled in Gardena

A preview of an all-day anti-Communist program to be held in San Pedro on Nov. 25 has been scheduled for Monday at the Veterans of Foreign Wars post in Gardena, beginning at 8 p.m.

Col. George W. Nevils, U.S. Marine Corps (Ret.), will present the film, "Our American Heritage," and will speak on the same subject following the film.

Colonel Nevils has retired from the service to devote himself as director of public relations for California Free Enterprise Assn.

The San Pedro program the following Saturday to be held at the San Pedro High School, is expected to attract more than 2,000 persons to hear

Fred Hall, former governor of Kansas.

The day will begin at 8:30 a.m. and is scheduled to continue until 5 p.m., according to Ted Bruinsma, chairman. He said the all-day seminar is being conducted "to create a sense of responsibility as free Americans and to educate and inform people on the menace of communism."

Representatives of service clubs, chambers of commerce, women's organizations, and student groups are expected to support both events, officials said.

Freedom Rider to Be Speaker

Philip Posner, who is scheduled to stand trial in April in Jackson, Miss., for his efforts on behalf of the Freedom Riders, will be guest speaker tomorrow night at the Temple Menorah.

The program will start at 8:30. Posner is a pre-rabbinical student at the Los Angeles Hebrew Union College. After graduation from UCLA in February of next year, he will commence full time training as a reform rabbi.

He will talk about his experiences as a Freedom Rider which brought him a sentence for disturbing the peace. He is out on bail which was posted by CORE.

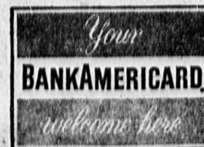
