Budget Adopted

The largest budget in the history of the Calvary Baptist Church, 2818 Manhattan Beach Blvd., was adopted at the business meeting of the church last week.

Significant increase over the 1960 budget will fall in the area of the retirement of the bond program which was is-

sued to finance the new sanctuary, to be dedicated Dec. 3. The budget of \$71,255.00 provides for a well-balanced program of support for local work as well as world missions.

Next Sunday will bring to a climax the current "Tithing is Love in Action" stewardship emphasis, and the day is being designated "Ingathering Sunday." During the morning services, church members will present their commitment cards in a spirit of Thanksgiving to

the Lord, thereby designating their faith commitments for 1962. The pastor will bring the message of the morning prior to the commitment service at both 8:30 and 11.

Next Sunday the Women's Mission Society will be in charge of the 7 p.m. "Missionary Night" program.

Twenty volunteer workers labored last Saturday at the new Sanctuary sight on installing the carpet, making preparation for pouring the patio floor, and in landscaping. Again next Saturday crews will continue with the landscaping and the patio development.

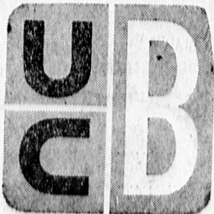
