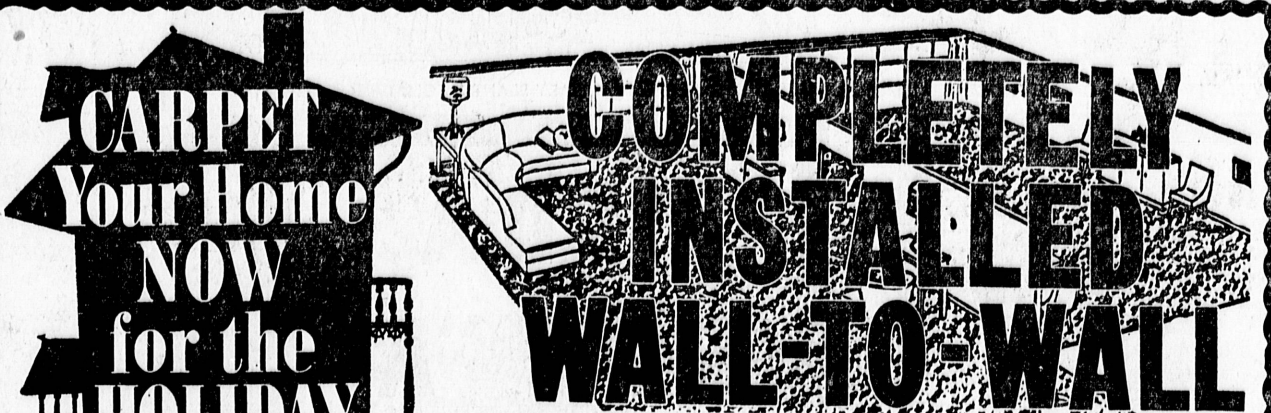
Fuchsia Society Meeting Nov. 20

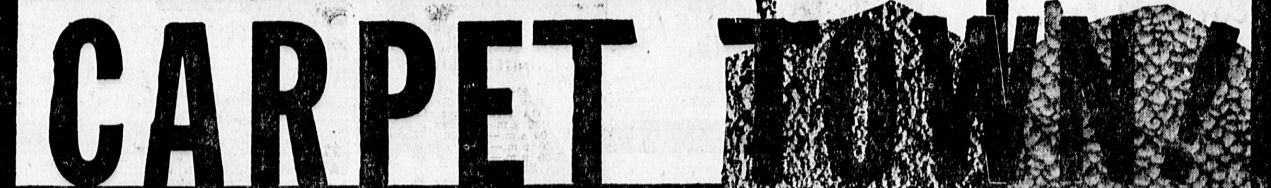
