# Big Ben Discount Store to Open on Friday at Noon

A huge replica of London's famous Big Ben clock at Pacific Coast Highway and Crenshaw Boulevard will point the way to the first Big Ben discount center when it opens at noon Friday.

The 35-department, major shopping building, built in buff and tan at a cost of \$800,000, will contain a continuing \$3 million inventory of nationally advertised merchandise to be sold at discount prices, according to Obby Gribow, president of Big Ben Stores, Inc.

The Big Ben tower, complete with chimes, was designed

and erected by the Heath Company, Los Angeles, from charts and photographs of the original tower in London, built in 1856. The Torrance tower is contemporary in design, but is faithful to all features of the original Big Ben Clock.

The clock will sound chimes which will signify bargain specials in the store, and announce the hours from noon until 10 p.m. The clock will also play music during the holidays.

Six additional Big Ben centers will be built in Southern California during 1962. The Torrance store, with outside parking for 2,000 cars, will

feature the following departments: grocery; meat; produce; men's, women's and children's clothing; sporting goods; hardware gifts; pharmacy drugs and allied units.
