

Contemporary Painters Shown in Local Exhibit

An art exhibit featuring the works of local, contemporary painters is now on display at the Del Amo office of Glendale Federal Savings and Loan Assn., 3832 Sepulveda Blvd.

Featured in the display will be watercolors by Larry Rink, serigraphs by Sister Mary Corita, I.H.M., and pencil drawings by Mae Babitz.

Larry Rink has received many honors for his watercolors, and the latest won second prize at the Barnsdall All-City Art Festival.
