"Holiday Basket of Cheer" was awarded to Russell Cramer, 5158 W. Slauson, Los Angeles.

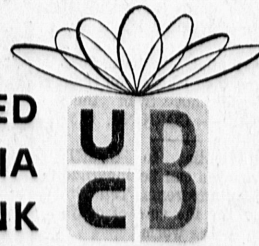
