# SAXONS BATTLE EL RANCHO

## Dons Defend Crown Against North High

Already boasting one of the finest grid seasons in its short athletic history, North High will attempt to reach another rung on the ladder of success when the Saxon juggernaut marches onto the El Rancho High field tomorrow at 8 p.m. to meet the Dons in the opening round of the AAA Division CIF Playoffs.

Although having accumulated an 8-1 season record and finishing second behind Inglewood in the Bay League, the Saxons will be listed as underdogs against the undefeated, once tied Dons, co-champions in the San Gabriel Valley League and AAA Division CIF crown-bearer last year.

With an 8-0-1 slate for the campaign, El Rancho boasts a defense which has allowed only three foes to score. North head coach Bob Shoup terms the Don defensive line as "Big and strong — good tacklers." Shoup believes defense is El Rancho's strong point.

Operating from the multiple pro-spread in its more complicated forms, the Dons are not an explosive team, preferring to stay on the ground and bull it out rather than take to the air lanes.

IF THE occasion calls for it though, El Rancho has a quarterback who can fling the pigskin. Garcia Ynez has thrown only 34 times this season, but has completed 18, six of which were good for the six-pointer.

Coach Shoup describes Ynez as a fine QB, but "more human" than last year's Don quarterback Marshall Adair, who was one of the finest signal callers seen around these parts for quite a while.

EL RANCHO'S defense is termed by Shoup as "probably finer than any we have faced all year long," but the grid boss does not believe the Dons are as explosive an outfit as Inglewood or Hawthorne.

In evaluating his chances to go all the way in the playoffs and bring the championship home to rest in Torrance, Shoup believes, "It is illogical, a mathematical improbability since we would have to upset four teams in a row."

THE AFFABLE Shoup praises his squad's spirit for the contest and points out the lack of injuries to his club. Only Rick Melinda, center, has been put out for any length of time during the season. Melinda was lost for the year after an injury in a pre-season practice.

Doug Ball, the hero of last week's Redondo clash, scoring two TDs from his fullback slot, is a doubtful participant in tomorrow's titanic. Ball was taken to the doctor on Tuesday when fluid draining into his knee from a muscle injury immobilized his leg. Even if the doc gives Ball the okay, Bob Marebela will start in his place.

## Camino Hoop Squad Engages Vaqueros

Aiming to improve an 11-18 record accumulated last year, El Camino College cagers will open the basketball season tomorrow night, traveling to Glendale for a practice engagement with the Vaqueros and then returning home to battle College of the Sequoias, Saturday at 8 p.m.

Glendale City College is perennially a title contender in the Western Conference and should prove a good opening test for Coach George Stanich's crew.

Saturday will mark the Tribe's first home hoop encounter of the season and will pit ECC against Central California Junior College Athletic Association might, College of the Sequoias.

LACK OF experience is the main drawback to this season's Camino five. Only three lettermen return from last year's squad. Dave Brown, Dan Karavas, and Mike Schrader earned their monograms from El Camino last year and will be back to spearhead this year's hoopers.

Boasting 11 men over the six-foot mark, the Warriors should have no trouble because of height. Paul Bush at 6'5" is the tallest ECC cager. Keith Erickson and Paul Ingleman, at 6'4" follow Bush in the height department.

CAMINO edged Glendale 70 to 65 in its encounter last year, but did not fare as well against College of the Sequoias, losing to the Giants, 94-90.

Long John Conroy, standing 6'9" and tipping the scales at 220 pounds will lead the Giants Saturday night. Conroy is not the only skyscraper on

the Sequoia five with 6'7" Jim Heman and Harold Crew, 6'5" Mike Manro, and 6'4" Bob Yahne and Bill Lambert also holding down formidable positions on the squad.

WITH SIX lettermen returning, the Giants reportedly have their finest team since the 1958 club took the conference championship and went on to finish fourth in state playoffs, setting a new scoring record in the process.

One oddity of the contest is the fact that Giant coach P. F. Whithansen will be starting his 22nd year as head instructor for the northerners.

Playing its second game of the season, College of the Sequoias will probably start Conroy, 6'9"; Mario Peele, 6'1"; Herb Schmidt, 5'9"; Larry Wait, 6'1", and 6'4" Bob Yahne. The Giants will open with a first string averaging 6'2" in height.

El Camino College boss Stanich has not yet selected a starting five.

IN ORDER to shape up a workable unit, Coach Stanich cut an opening day turnout of over 40 cagers to a more mobile 15 athletes. The original turnout was one of the largest in the college's history.

Comprising this year's Warrior squad will be Dave Brown, 6'; Paul Bush, 6'5"; Ron Dinkel, 6'3"; Keith Erickson, 6'4"; Gary Gonnerman, 5'10½"; Vern Holte, 5'11"; Paul Ingleman, 6'4"; Dick Jones, 5'9"; Dan Karavas, 6'1½"; Ron Lewis, 6'2"; Gary Nix, 6'½"; Ed Turner, 6'1"; Bob Withers, 6'; and Dave Yanai, 5'9". John Laxio and Ed Neubauer will manage the hoop club.

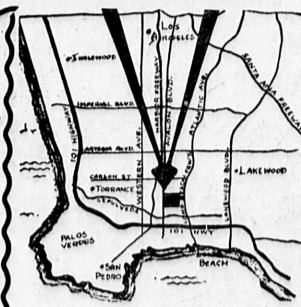

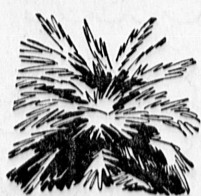

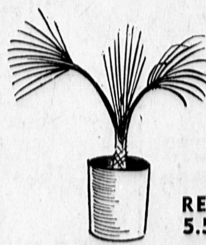
