stricter control of children because of the presence of the bridge.

Continued study of the problem was promised by the councilmen.

CRITICISM of luncheon meetings held monthly by the Torrance Traffic Safety Council was voiced by Councilman Victor Benstead. He challenged the legality of the meetings, stating he thought they were in violation of the Brown Act, which prohibits secret meetings of legislative bodies. Benstead asked the city attorney to submit a written opinion on the legality of the sessions.

The traffic safety group holds a monthly luncheon meeting to discuss problems in that field, and to hear experts in the field.

REPRESENTATIVES of the city's service clubs, PTA units, and other civic groups comprise the membership of the organization, and half a hundred normally attend the meetings.

Councilmen also took a look at the poker situation in California, and agreed by a split decision to go on record in favor of the move to outlaw draw poker in the state. Councilmen Benstead and Vico opposed the motion offered by Councilman Dralle.
