

The use of a "jet age" fleet of passenger helicopters to complement the rapid transit system planned for the Los An-geles area is being investigated by the MTA, according to Board Chairman A. J. Eyraud said discussions are under way with President Clar-ence Belinn and other officials of Los Angeles Airways, Inc., to determine how passenger helicopter service can best be integrated into the entire pub-lic transit operation.
