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Indeed, it has been stated that the average life span of the approximately 350,000 alcoholics who die annually in the United States is only 51 years. This compares to a life expectancy of about 70 years for the nonalcoholic.

According to one definition, alcoholism occurs when people continue to drink heavily in spite of the painful and injurious consequences they suffer. Physical injury from drinking may include stomach, liver, and kidney damage and various forms of neuritis. Over long periods, excessive drink-

ing may also cause serious nervous and mental disorders. Actually, not all alcoholics are addicts. Some persons drink excessively and with serious consequences, but are still able to stop whenever they want to. In the case of the alcohol addict, such control does not exist.

The number of individuals who drink excessively to the point of mental or physical injury is larger than one might expect, and estimates place the number of problem drinkers in the country at about five million. This figure does not reflect the true gravity of the

situation however. It does not, for instance, include the families of alcoholics whose lives may be disastrously affected. If it did, the number of persons involved would be several times greater.

WHY SOME persons are impelled to drink excessively, and others are not, is only partially understood. At any rate, of the six out of every 10 adults in the United States who use alcohol, one out of every 15 of these users eventually becomes an alcoholic.

A number of causes for alcoholism have been suggested. Some psychiatrists believe that certain individuals, finding it impossible to cope with the problems and crises of everyday living, turn to alcohol as a way out. On the other hand, some medical scientists believe that alcoholism may have a physical or biological cause, such as a defect in the body chemistry or some nutritional deficiency.

Although no conclusive evidence is yet available on the causes of alcoholism, individuals who drink to excess have been found to have certain traits in common. In general, these include emotional immaturity, preoccupation with self, insecurity, and feelings of guilt. What makes the problem so complicated is that it is possible for people to have any or all of these traits and still not be alcoholics.

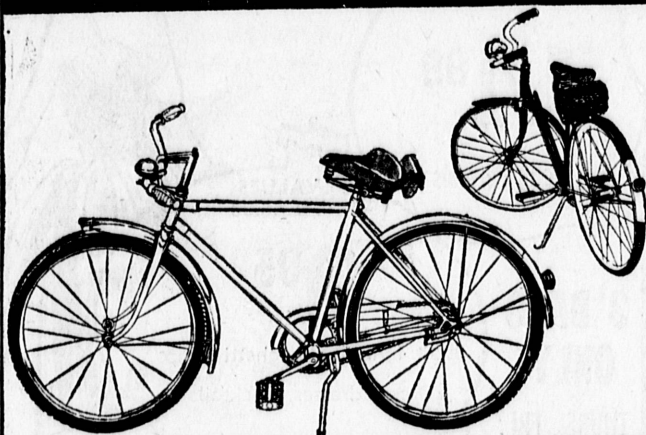
ONLY A START has been made in dealing with the problem of the alcoholic. Until

recently, alcoholics were generally considered deserving of punishment rather than help. This attitude is rapidly changing, and there is considerable evidence that alcoholics may be considered as having a chronic and disabling illness that can only be arrested. At this stage of medical knowledge, the disease can not be cured.

In addition to whatever medical treatment is given, an alcoholic needs emotional support and guidance. Remarkable success has been achieved in rehabilitation by the group of dedicated people who comprise Alcoholics Anonymous. Since its inception in 1935, this organization has helped restore more than a quarter million alcoholics to sobriety and well-adjusted living.

AN ALCOHOLIC is a sick person, and continued heavy drinking is a symptom of his basic illness. Treatment and understanding will help, but condemnation is both cruel and useless.

In order to focus public attention on the urgency of the problem, the National Council on Alcoholism is sponsoring a nationwide Alcohol Information Week, Nov. 26 to Dec. 2.
