The next regular meeting will be at the home of Mrs. Everson.

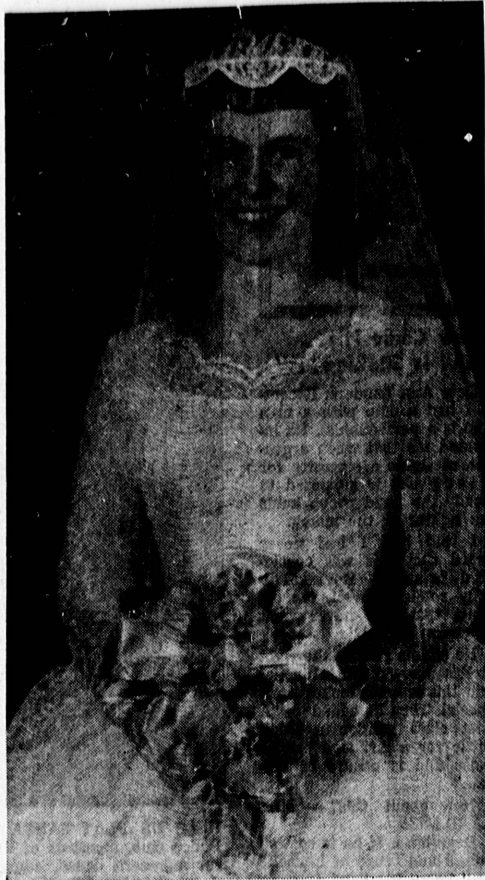
## Party Honors Bobbi Lynn

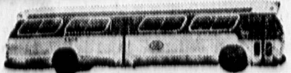
