BEST BUYS FOR THE WEEK

Homemakers seldom have, FRUITS AND VEGETABLES a wider selection at meat, poultry, and fish counters. It's hardly necessary to remind ourselves that chicken and turkey are in heavy supand turkey are in heavy supply. They are being "specialed" along with beef, lamb, pork, and veal. Veal is the one probably not in as general heavy distribution, but you will find it a pleasant change.

Veal needs long, slow cooking because it lacks fat and it has a lot of connective tissue. It is the flesh of a young animal and is tender, but the connective tissue toughens during cooking at

toughens during cooking at high temperatures. Veal is best either roasted

Veal is best either roasted or braised, and should always be cooked to the well-done stage. For oven roasting use 300°F, for 25 minutes to the pound. Boned, rolled shoulder takes 40 to 45 minutes per pound. The loin and rack should be timed at 30 to 35 minutes per pound.

A stuffed or rolled breast takes about 2 hours of braising. Plan 21/2 hours for stew. Birds, chops, and steaks take about 34 to 1 hour of brais-

ing.
