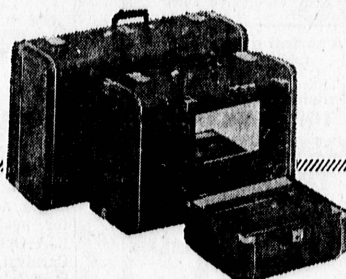

Boy Scout Appears On Queen For a Day

John Sohner of 3204 Danaha St., was one of four Boy Scouts appearing on nationally televised ABC Queen for a Day "special show" broadcast Friday.

Although he was not elected Boy Scout King for a Day, John's wish will be granted, and he will join the other candidates in a whirl of Hollywood.

Each of the Boy Scout candidates selected from the studio audience to be interviewed on the show by M.C. Jack Bailey will receive a term at scout summer camp, a bicycle, an electric shoe polisher, a watch, and a pair of binoculars. They joined "King Larry" Clark of Pico-Rivera in a tour of Hollywood, lunching with Duke Snider at the Brown Derby, visiting Warner Brothers studios, and dinner at a famous restaurant. They were "guests of honor" when the entire studio audience of more than 900 boys attended the ice hockey game between the Los Angeles Blades and the Canutes on Tuesday.

DURING HIS interview, 12-year-old John told the audience he had originally planned to "wish" for a set of drums. He plays in the Gardena Band, he added. However, just before coming to the show he learned that the family television set of a young friend had broken and the family could not afford to have it repaired. And the young scout changed his wish from something for himself to "a television set for my friend."

John is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Frank Sohner and his own family includes two sisters.

Larry's wish was for a "complete Cub Scout uniform for a young friend who is blind." The young cub must have a complete uniform to march in the parades with his troop,

Larry explained, and the young boy wanted very much to join his patrol in their reviews.

OTHER BOYS appearing on the show included 9-year-old Cub Scout Richard Pesqueira of Los Angeles, and 9-year-old Cub Scout Edmond Lewis, also of Los Angeles.

After the coronation of the King, M.C. Jack Bailey announced to the delighted audience of more than 900 Cubs and Boy Scouts from the Los Angeles area, that because each of the four candidates had wished for something that would help others, each of the boys would be granted his wish.
