## Betty's Banana Bread

|----------------|---------------------|
| 1 cup sugar    | 1 teaspoon soda     |
| 1/2 cup butter | 1/2 teaspoon salt   |
| 2 eggs         | 1/4 teaspoon nutmeg |
| 2 cups flour   | 3 or 4 bananas      |
| 1/2 cup nuts   | (very ripe)         |

Cream sugar, butter, two eggs. Sift together 2 cups flour, soda, salt, nutmeg. Add sifted ingredients to butter mixture. Mix in bananas, which have been beaten slightly. Add nut meats, walnuts, pecans or filberts.

Pour mixture in large loaf pan or two small loaf pans. Bake 3/4 to 1 hour in oven at 350 degrees.

## Party Chafing Dish

| 1/4 cup butter           | dash of pepper          |
| 3 Tablespoon flour       | 1/2 teaspoon            |
| 1 cup milk               | Worcestershire sauce    |
| 1 small can mushrooms    | 1 can cream mushroom    |
| (sliced buttons & juice) | soup                    |
| 1 tablespoon celery      | 1 tablespoon pimiento   |
| (finely chopped)         | 4 cup grated cheese     |
| 1/4 teaspoon paprika     | 5 or 6 hard boiled eggs |
| 1 cup small shrimp       | (slice or wedge)        |
| (cooked)                 | 1/4 cup white wine      |
| 1/2 teaspoon salt        | (optional)              |

Make a white sauce of butter, flour, milk, salt, and pepper in top of double boiler. When thickened add Worcestershire sauce, mushroom soup, mushrooms, celery, pimiento. About 15 minutes before serving add remaining ingredients. Bring to serving temperature, stirring carefully. Pour into warmed chafing dish. Serve over thin toast, fluffy rice or chow mein noodles. Serves 8.

## Holiday Salad

| 1 box cherry Jello        | 1/2 cup walnuts        |
| 1 cup hot water           | (chopped slightly)     |
| 1/2 cup pineapple juice   | 1/4 cup chopped apple  |
| (chilled)                 | 1/4 cup chopped celery |
| 1 cup crushed pineapple   | 1/4 teaspoon salt      |
| 1/2 lb. fresh cranberries | 1/4 cup sugar          |
| 1/4 orange (unpeeled)     |                        |

Add water to Jello. When dissolved, add chilled pineapple juice. Set aside to jell slightly. Grind cranberries and orange. Mix with nuts, apple, celery, pineapple, sugar and salt. Stir until sugar and salt are dissolved. Combine with Jello, which should be jelled enough to keep fruit from floating. Pour into mold and chill until firm. Serve with 1 cup mayonnaise into which the juice of two oranges has been added. Garnish with greens.

## Applesauce Tarte

|---------------------------|----------------------|
| 2 cups thick apple sauce  | 3 eggs               |
| 1 1/2 cups ground almonds | 1 pint whipped cream |
| 1 1/2 tablespoons sugar   | 2 tablespoons sugar  |
| (powdered)                | 1 teaspoon vanilla   |

Pour apple sauce into a buttered baking dish. Mix almonds and sugar. Separate eggs. Beat the egg yolks in one at a time. Whip the egg whites until stiff and combine with the yolk mixture. Pour combined mixture over the apple sauce and bake in oven for about 1 1/2 hour at 400 degrees. Serve luke warm with lots of whipped cream, with optional sugar and vanilla.
