Torrance Teacher to Talk To Area Educational Group

The South Bay Assn. of Educational Office Employees will meet this evening at 7:30 at Center School, Manhattan Beach.

Following a short business meeting conducted by Mrs. Harry Crook, of Torrance, will introduce the featured speaker of the evening, John Tucker, whose topic is entitled "Education in Europe."

Tucker received his education at Occidental College and USC, interrupted by his service as an engineer in the Merchant Marine during World War II. He joined the staff of the Torrance Unified School District as a regular teacher in 1953, and in 1959 became a teacher in the field of Special Education.

TUCKER TOOK his Sabbatical leave during the 1960-61 school year, and toured Europe, studying their types and methods of education. In his tour he visited the British Isles, Ireland, Germany, Austria, Yugoslavia, Greece, Turkey, Lebanon, Italy, and Spain.

His extensive study of education in these areas provides the basis for a most interesting and informative lecture, which will be followed by a question and answer period.

Guests will be greeted by Mrs. Anna Fuller, hospitality chairman, of Manhattan Beach, assisted by her co-workers.

New State Laws on Polio Inoculation Begin Jan. 1

New sections of the Health and Safety Code, passed at the last session of the State Legislature, provide for mandatory poliomyelitis immunization of all school pupils in the State of California.

The requirement applies in general to all pupils of any age admitted to public or private primary or secondary schools, including kindergarten, junior college, and adult education classes.

THREE SALK-TYPE polio immunizations are currently required; however, a pupil may be admitted with one immunization provided the series of three shots is obtained within a period of one year.

For pupils immunized with three injections of polio prior to Jan. 1, 1962, a signed statement by parents or guardians stating this fact with the approximate dates of immunizations will suffice. For pupils immunized after Jan. 1, 1962, a certificate must be obtained from the authorized agency or physician administering the vaccine.

THE CERTIFICATE must state: (a) Name of immunized person, (b) Birthdate, (c) Date of each immunization, (d) Type of vaccine used (Salk or three types of oral), (e) Name of

agency or physician administering vaccine.

For those persons who may not believe in immunization, a statement stating this fact must be submitted in writing to school authorities and signed by the parent or guardian for all students under the age of 21.

IF YOUR CHILD has not yet been immunized against polio, please obtain this immunization at the earliest possible time so that the series of three shots may be administered prior to the January 1962 deadline. These immunizations are available through your physician, Los Angeles County Medical Assn., polio clinics, any National Foundation Clinic, and at your local health center.

The Torrance schools are providing forms for recording of immunization data. For further information parents should contact the principal of their local school.

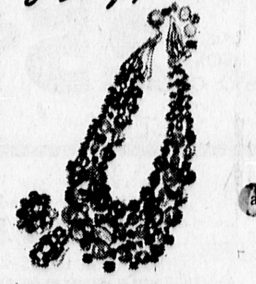
