

Need for Vocational Nurse Trainees Told by College

The need for training more vocational nurses was emphasized today by Roberta Lindberg, director of the vocational nursing program at Harbor College, in announcing openings for next semester's program.

"This is an especially rewarding field for men and women up to the age of 50 who would like to train for an essential job offering many employment opportunities at good starting salaries in the Harbor area."

Those interested in the program should phone Harbor College to make arrangements to take the regular entrance examination scheduled for the following dates: Monday, Dec. 11, at 6 p.m.; Thursday, Jan. 4, at 6 p.m.; Saturday, Jan. 13, at 9 a.m. and Monday, Jan. 22, at 6 p.m.

The vocational nursing training course, which qualifies a graduate to take the state examination to become a licensed vocational nurse, is open to both men and women who have completed a 10th grade education or its equivalent.
