

'Mister Roberts' Scheduled For January Run at College

Appearing as the lead in the El Camino College midwinter play, "Mister Roberts," will be Cliff Potts of Manhattan Beach. The play, scheduled to run Jan. 12, 13, 19 and 20, will feature Potts in the title role and will be composed of 21 student actors.

Potts, a graduate of Mira Costa High School, was active in theater arts there and has portrayed roles in "Remarkable Mr. Pennypacker," "Inherit the Wind," "Twelfth Night," "South Pacific" and "Madwoman of Chaillot" on the El Camino campus.

HE HAS also played in various productions at Hampton Playhouse. Other leading players in the "Mister Roberts" cast are John Leifhelm, Inglewood; Lee McLaughlin, Torrance; Dennis Morgan, El Segundo, and Ron Murphy, Redondo Beach.

Doc, portrayed by Leifhelm, shows an ironic acceptance of things as he finds them. Leifhelm has appeared in the "Madwoman of Chaillot" and is completing his first semester in theater arts at El Camino.

PORTRAYING the captain, against whom the men of the ship wage war, is McLaughlin, a theater arts major. A former football and baseball player, McLaughlin took part in "Romeo and Juliet," "Alladin and His Wonderful Lamp," and the Christmas play, "Everyman."

The war is a personal adventure which has lost its glamour to Ensign Pulver, played by Morgan, who is a

graduate of Inglewood High School and a second semester student at EC. He has held parts in "Romeo and Juliet," and "Pygmalion" at ECC and "The Show-off," while attending Santa Ana College.

OTHERS in the cast include Murphy, Dowdy; Jam Coleman, Stefanowski; Jerry Cole, Wiley; and Miss Stephanie Smith, Ann Gerard, all from Redondo Beach; David Pritchard, Insigna; Vic Nastasia, Mannion, and Dennis Scholl, Chief Petty Officer Johnson, all from Inglewood.

Completing the cast are Steve Rinaldi, Lindstrom, Redondo; Craig Thompson, Schlemmer, Torrance; Dale Hall, Gerhart, and Rick Crowell, Shore Officer, from El Segundo, Paul Wilkening, Military Policeman, Manhattan Beach, and Mike Hector, "Shore Patrolman," from Torrance.

Sets for the production will be constructed by stage craft students under the direction of instructor Les Thomas.

STUDENT producer for the midwinter production will be Miss Carolyn Waddingham, Torrance, while costumes will be under the direction of Miss Julie O'Neil of Hawthorne and Miss Ila Archibald of Torrance. Burnett Ferguson is faculty advisor.

Props are being directed by Miss Shirley Turk, Miss Gail Wilkins, Manhattan Beach, and Miss Sally Slater of Torrance. Tickets for the annual midwinter production will be on sale in the student store following the Christmas holidays.
