(l) Yukon Avenue — between northerly city limits and 190th Street.

(m) Arlington Avenue — between northerly city limits and Border Avenue; between Carson Street and southerly city limits.

(n) Cabrillo Avenue — between Torrance Boulevard and southerly city limits.

(o) Border Avenue — between Arlington Avenue and Plaza Del Amo.
