## Rare Coin Exhibit Due Here

Through the cooperation of several members of the Numismatic Society of Southern California, Southwest Savings and Loan will display its impressive "Coins of the World" exhibit from Jan. 1 through Jan. 10. ## St. James To Open Mission

A three-week Mission will be held at St. James Catholic Church, Redondo Beach, beginning Dec. 31, and closing Sunday morning, Jan. 21, according to an announcement by the Rev. J. Augustin O'Gorman, pastor of the parish.

Appropriately at the start of the New Year, the Mission is a program to revitalize the spiritual lives of the parishioners through a course of sermons and religious exercises given by a missionary priest.

The Rev. Edward J. McDonald, CSP, of Portland, Ore., is the guest speaker. He has served churches throughout the United States and Canada, and for five years was a chaplain in the United States Air Force. A member of the Paulist Fathers, a society which was founded a hundred years ago by five priests who were converts to the Catholic Church, he offers a special welcome to non-Catholics.

MONDAY, TUESDAY, and Wednesday of the first week of the Mission will be for the women. The second week a similar program will be held for the men. A series of talks in explanation of the Catholic Faith will be delivered during the third week for the benefit of non-Catholics. Every Thursday will be for teenagers.

All evening services begin at 7:30 and will last about an hour. Sunday Masses are at 6, 7, 8, 9, 10:15 and 12:15 o'clock. During the week Masses are celebrated at 6:30 and 8 a.m., and will be followed by short talks.

New Year's Masses are at 6, 7, 8, 9, 10:15, 11:15 a.m. and 12:15 p.m. Special evening Mass is at 7.

## Area Zoning Change Before Commission

A change in the front building setback requirement on 218th Street between Harvard Boulevard and Western Avenue has been recommended by Los Angeles City Planning Director, John E. Roberts. Roberts' recommendation is based on the report of City Planner Manus D. O'Grady who conducted a public hearing in Wilmington on Dec. 11.

The new setback of 15 feet from the property line was requested by property owner Dante Marocco who proposes to build several apartment buildings on the north side of the street. Apartments are now permitted in this block because of a recent change to R3 zoning.

Previously a 30-foot setback would be required in this block because of the location of the existing buildings.

If approved by the City Planning Commission, the matter will go to the City Council for final action.
