## 'Family Night' Symphony Concert Slated Tonight

The true spirit of the Christmas season will prevail tonight at the Redondo Union High School auditorium as the Civic Symphony gives its annual "Family Night" concert. The concert will get underway at 8 p.m. There is no admission charge, although some seats will be reserved for a one dollar donation.

Brimming over with Christmas music, the program will begin with the musical setting by Humperdink for the fairy tale, Hansen and Gretel. A 157-voice chorus of young people from Manhattan Beach Center

School, with Everett Covin directing, will be accompanied by the symphony in the "Prayer" from the opera: "When at night I go to sleep, Fourteen angels watch do keep."

THE WALTZ and Polonaise from Tschaikovsky's Eugene Onegin will follow.

After the intermission, Debussy's delicate and amusing "Children's Corner" suite will be performed. Two solos from the "Messiah" will be sung by the well-known and popular prima donna, Celina Sanchez.

The audience will be asked to join in the symphony and chorus for four carols, and the program will conclude with "Realms of Glory."

Following the concert, the children attending will be invited to come back stage and meet the symphony members.
