Dr. Romeo to Head Hospital Medical Staff
Dr. Mathew P. Romeo has been named president of the Little Company of Mary Hospital medical staff.

Dr. Romeo, who has specialized in internal medicine in Torrance for seven and a half years, joined the Little Company of Mary medical staff in 1958. Since that time he has been instrumental in organizing the medical staff and in guiding the hospital through the critical stages of its development.
He has, at various times, served as chairman of the Department of Medicine, chairman of the By-Laws Committee, and as a member of the Executive, Tissue, Emergency Room, and Record committees.

Church Bond Sale Outlined

Plans to sell "diversified" financing service notes to refinance a recently purchased church site at 228th Street and Ocean Avenue have been announced by the Del Amo Southern Baptist Church.
The plan also includes a proposal to erect the first unit of an extended building program at the new site, according to Earl May, general chairman of the committee spearheading the bond sales campaign.
The bonds will be in denominations of \$1,000, \$500 and \$100 with each bearing 6 per cent interest payable twice a year and maturing serially from one to 15 years.

Polio Shots Required

Requirements concerning proof of polio immunization for new junior college students were clarified today by William McMasters, assistant dean of admissions at Harbor College.
New sections of the Health and Safety Code passed at the last session of the legislature provide that all pupils newly admitted to any school in the spring 1962 semester must provide proof of immunization.
"This applies to all new students, including adults, in both public and private schools from kindergarten through the junior college and adult education level," said McMasters. "In September 1962 this will be extended to all students, new and old. There has been some doubt as to whether this regulation applies to junior college students. I can say definitely that it does."
"For the sake of their own health as well as to facilitate enrollment procedures, I urge everyone to obtain their polio shots as soon as possible," stated McMasters.
