Enlistment **Changes Told Bv** Recruiter

Chief H. J. Piech, local Navy recruiter, announced this week that length of enlistment op-tions are now extended to broken-service recenlistees. Broken service recenlistees are men who have been dis-charsed from the service out-

charged from the service over three months. Personnel in this category are now permitted to reenlist for a period of two, three, four, or six years. In addition men who were pre-viously ineligible for reenlistviously ineligible for reenlist-ment due to not having quali-fied for petty officer status are now eligible for reenlistment.
