### Downtown Torrance Store To Stay, Newberrys Say

Reports circulating throughout the downtown area that the J. J. Newberry Store at Sartori and El Prado might close were strongly denied yesterday by Manager Merle Shoemaker.

"Newberrys is in Downtown Torrance to stay," Shoemaker said in answer to the reports. "A lot of rumors have reached us lately that we would be closing our store here on Sartori," he said. "I can't discover (or imagine) where these rumors have originated, but I can say that they have absolutely no basis in fact," he added.

The manager explained that the lease on the property does not expire until Dec. 31, 1960, and that "frankly, we are looking beyond that date."

Adding that the company had "no intentions of leaving Downtown Torrance," Shoemaker said the firm hopes "in years to come we may even be able to improve our facilities in order that we might

better serve our customers in this area.

"We have appreciated the patronage of the people of this area over the past many years and are certainly looking forward to many more pleasant and productive years in Downtown Torrance," he said.

"I surely hope this will help to dispel these entirely false rumors," he added.

### 'Christian Science' Is Sunday Topic
