

# Hampton Players to Open New Production Tomorrow Evening

About one third of the large cast of Hampton Players' new production, "The Visit," opening tomorrow night in Redondo Beach, are residents of Torrance.

In the key roles of "First Man" and "First Woman" are

George Stefan of the Hollywood Riviera section, and Suzanne Shinder of Torrance. Stefan has been a devoted follower of all Hampton's activities since its inception 11 years ago, but this is his first time on stage.

Mrs. Shinder has recently been seen in the Torrance Footlight Theatre's productions, "Lady Precious Stream" and "White Sheep of the Family," while her previous experience goes back to little theater in New York and school plays in her town of origin, Manchester, England. Almost the entire Shinder family has become involved in "The Visit," with daughter Lorraine and husband Floyd also playing small roles.

 Students in the show are Hal Lepper, who has been seen in numerous Hampton and Chapel Theatre productions, and is presently Hampton's house manager; Phyllis Foss, last seen on the Hampton stage in "Death of a Salesman;" Carol Foss, her daughter, who was one of the charming daughters in "The Loud Red Patrick;" Art Grigg, a new member of Hampton; and Barbara Bennett, who has worked on plays for the

Hampton, Footlight, and Drawing Room Theatres. Two pioneers of Hampton Players, Bob Farnsworth and Hal Douglas, have teamed up to direct this fascinating adult drama, and Jack Drake and Marie Denn, well known local actors, are playing the lead roles.

**THE STORY** is one of a lifetime plan for revenge, and the effect this plan has upon the population of an entire town. It is an absorbing study

in human nature, and while basically a tragedy, its comic overtones and brilliant writing keep it from ever becoming depressing.

## College Nursing Plan Set

Reimbursement funds up to the amount of \$4,000 have been awarded to El Camino College under the provisions of the W. K. Kellogg Foundation grant to aid the college in the planned nursing program.

The support is destined to provide assistance to the college during the planning year for an associate in arts degree for nursing students. The new program is scheduled to begin the fall semester of 1962.

Application for the grant, submitted by ECC to the Coordinating Committee of the California Associated Arts Nursing Project, was reviewed and passed this fall.

Completion of two academic years of study and two six-week summer courses will enable the nursing student to obtain an AA degree, under the provisions of the grant.

Students must take courses in basic sciences and in theory and practice of nursing. Non-nursing courses will balance the nursing classes to satisfy the requirements.

After graduation the student is eligible to qualify as a registered nurse.

## Arranging of Flowers to Be Taught

The art of Japanese flower arranging will be taught in a course beginning today at the city plunge, 3331 Torrance Blvd.

The series of six Thursday evening lessons will be taught by Sachiko Sakomizu, UCLA graduate student. Miss Sakomizu received her instructor's degree in flower arranging in Japan.

Included in the Torrance Recreation Department course will be the fundamentals of Japanese flower arranging, including selection of materials, containers and accessories.

Fee for the course is \$3.75; flowers may be ordered through the instructor at 30 cents a week or the individual may bring her own. The class will meet each Thursday from 7:30 to 9:30 p.m.

Registrations will be accepted at the first lesson of the series today, or by calling the Recreation Department, FA 8-5310.
