For Torrance area real estate brokers and salesmen, trust officers, and those in allied fields, University Extension at UCLA has completed plans for eight classes in a spring certificate program in real estate.

The local classes will be held at North High School, 3620 W. 182nd St. Subjects available will be "Trends and Factors Influencing Real Estate," "Real Estate Practice," "Legal Aspects of Real Estate," "Real Estate Finance," "Principals of

Real Estate Appraisal," "Commercial and Investment Properties," "Real Estate Exchanges and Taxation," and "Income Aspects of Real Estate Transactions."

Enrollments will be accepted beginning Jan. 22, and instruction begins during the week of Feb. 5.

In addition to the Torrance program, classes are planned in Los Angeles, Buena Park, Pasadena, Ventura, and at UCLA and other centers.

## Two Courses in History, Political Science Slated

Two history and political science courses in special fields of interest have been scheduled for the evening division of Harbor College by Nicholas Zorotovich, chairman of the social science division.

The courses are "History of California," scheduled from 8 to 10 p.m. on Monday nights and taught by Pamela Bleich, and "Contemporary World Affairs," taught by Edward Robings on Thursday nights from 8 to 10 p.m.

The California history course will trace the social, intellectual, and political development of California from the earliest times to the present. Miss Bleich, a librarian at Harbor College, wrote her master's thesis in the field of California history.

In the "Contemporary World Affairs" class current news-magazines, lectures, and speakers will assist the student to develop an understanding of the background behind the headlines. Emphasis will be

placed on historical origins and economic developments.

"IT IS important that every college student, every citizen, be aware of what is going on in the world today," said Robings. "Events halfway round the globe threaten our very existence. The complexity of world affairs defies our understanding; conflicting attitudes and opinions of our writers and leaders leave us without easy answers to problems that confront us. We will attempt to develop a background in this course that will lead to an understanding of these complex issues."

Robings head of the Harbor College Business Division, has an extensive background in the social sciences. He is a graduate of UCLA.

Both college level courses are acceptable for credit at Long Beach State College and UCLA. Last date on which students may request a permit for registration is Friday, Jan. 19. After applying for the permit in the college admissions office, Room 151, the student will be given an appointment for completing his registration.
