

## Riviera Little League Backers in Big Switch

President Paul E. Kent of the Riviera Little League has announced that the league which has played ball for so many seasons at Kissel Field is now vacating the land due to plans for its commercial development. Saturday and Sunday of last week were "tear-down" days at the field with volunteer parents pitching in to dismantle fences, snack bars, and other equipment.

A new site behind the Rolling Hills Plaza shopping center at Crenshaw and Pacific Coast Highway is being readied for the spring season. Grading will start next week.
