

Pre-School Observation Class Set

Registrations for the Mc-Masters Child Observation Classes, in which mothers attend with their pre-school children ages two and one-half to five, will be held at the park at 9 a.m., Feb. 6, and Thursday, Feb. 8, Ray Collins Torrance Evening High School principal has announced.

The classes, three hours in length, feature one hour of adult discussion on parent education. During the first semester, ages and stages of child growth and development were stressed, and during this semester the roles of the modern mother in today's society will be explored. During the adult class session, led by Mrs. Lillian L. Randall, teacher, the children enjoy supervised play out of doors.

The remainder of the morning the children enjoy a program of play with creative materials such as clay and paint, juice, rest, finger games and songs, learning to cooperate with and enjoy their contemporaries while they manipulate puzzles and snap trains. Special features of the class are the children's and adult lending libraries. Mothers not only take written observations on their children's reactions and behavior, but also learn techniques in supervising groups of children at various types of play.

Cost of the classes is small; it includes \$3 registration fee, and a 25-cent incidental fee; also a 25-cent initial book fee. Mothers purchase all play equipment used in the program. A charge of 25 cents per child per morning for child care services is also made. Registration is limited to 40 adults. Mothers will also need to furnish information regarding polio immunization for themselves and children.
