Highway Financing Studied

A search for better methods to finance major street and road repair and improvements between now and 1980 is being undertaken by the Assembly's Interim Committee on Revenue and Finance.

Charles J. Hunt Jr., associate counsel for the Automobile Club of Southern California, appeared before the committee, headed by Assemblyman Charles H. Wilson of Los Angeles, and urged development of a sound and economical solution to the finance problem.

A possible solution to the problem is now being prepared by the Automobile Club of Southern California, engineers and safety and municipal finance authorities. This study is expected to be completed and ready for presentation to the state in the fall.

ACCORDING TO estimates \$5.5 billion will be needed to bring the major and collector roads up to a desirable engineering standard by 1980.

The problem is how to raise the necessary money on an equitable basis, Hunt says. According to Hunt the study now underway by the Automobile Club of Southern California is being based on a four point program:

- 1. Assurance that funds expended will be devoted to the more important local roads which are of greatest economic benefit to the community and which provide the greatest transportation service to the community.
2. Assurance that the cost of all improvements be shared by both the state and benefiting community.
3. THE HIGHWAY user and other beneficiaries should share the financing. State money should be derived from uniform statewide highway user taxes as the gasoline tax and registration and weight fees, while local money would include proceeds from traffic fines, property tax, special road improvement levies but not include highway user taxes.
4. Additional expenditures in accelerated local road improvements may be financed through some increase in statewide highway user taxes only if appropriate limitations are placed upon the use of funds and if local governments are willing to back up their claim for road needs through appropriate contributions from local funds.
