David Lyman Enters Race For Council

David K. Lyman, a Torrance attorney, has announced his candidacy for the Torrance City Council in the election to be held April 10. Lyman is a member of the State Bar of California and the South Bay Bar Assn., a member of the Junior Chamber of Commerce, Torrance; the Toastmaster's Club, Torrance; the Methodist Church, Torrance; the Kiwanis Club, Torrance; and the Elks Club, Torrance. Lyman is president of Torrance Democrats, Inc., and vice president of the Methodist Men's Club of Torrance.

HE IS A native of Los Angeles and was graduated by the University of Southern California in 1950 with a B.S. degree in business administration, and by the University of Southern California School of Law in 1953 with an LL.B. degree. During World War II he served with the U.S. Navy in the Naval Aviation Flight Training Program.

He has served industry in the past as an administrator and as corporate counsel for a major oil company.

LYMAN STATED that his campaign will be nonpartisan in nature and geared to those people who wish to improve Torrance as a fine place to live and work rather than aimed at the people who are interested in Torrance only as a means of profit. "I will avoid the extremes on both sides and attempt to formulate a program that is sound, workable, and progressive," Lyman said.
