

# Karavas All-Metro Guard

Culminating the Metropolitan Conference basketball season, dependable El Camino College guard Dan Karavas has been named to the first team all-conference five.

Joining the steady Karavas on the honor squad are Ollie Carter, Valley; Felix Patterson, East Los Angeles; Gary Adams, Santa Monica and Robbie Knudson, Bakersfield.

Two other Warriors were also honored by the Metro coaches. Center Keith Erickson and forward Ron Dinnel, both first-year men, landed honorable mention berths.

Karavas averaged 16.0 points per game during the conference campaign to finish eighth in the scoring department for the circuit. Deadly from the outside, Karavas was also dangerous with his patented, driving, twisting, corkscrew-type lay-ups.

PATTERSON paced all conference gunners with a 21.0 average, while Adams hit at a 20.3 clip.

Carter averaged 19.2 digits and Knudson was responsible for only 10.7 markers per contest.

Comprising the second team are Tim Sweeney, Long Beach; Al Windfield, Harbor; Larry Williams, Valley; Ed Cadis, Santa Monica, Al Catlin, San

Diego, and Loren Thompson, Bakersfield.

Also gaining honorable mention were Stan Swinger, Valley; Tom Bell, San Diego and Charles Campbell, Harbor.

Karavas will be in the line-up Friday, March 2 at Bakersfield when the Metro-champ Renegades battle the first and second string all-star squads.

PUTTING the finishing touches on a successful basketball campaign, El Camino split a pair of weekend clashes to finish in a tie for third place in the Metropolitan Conference.

Falling to fourth place after a narrow 94-91 defeat by Valley Friday night, the Warriors climbed back into the show position the following evening, slipping past San Diego, 74-70.

Bakersfield earned the top position in the conference, with Valley taking the runner-up slot. After dropping two of their first three contests, the Renegades came roaring back to take 11 straight victories and wait into their third straight conference crown.

El Camino chalked up an 8-6 conference record and wound up with a 14-14 mark for the season.

In his short two inning stint, Beck gave up another pair of bingles, while North was collecting six hits against two Lasuen hurlers.

to right field, and Kehoe demonstrated his prowess at the plate by driving him home with a double.

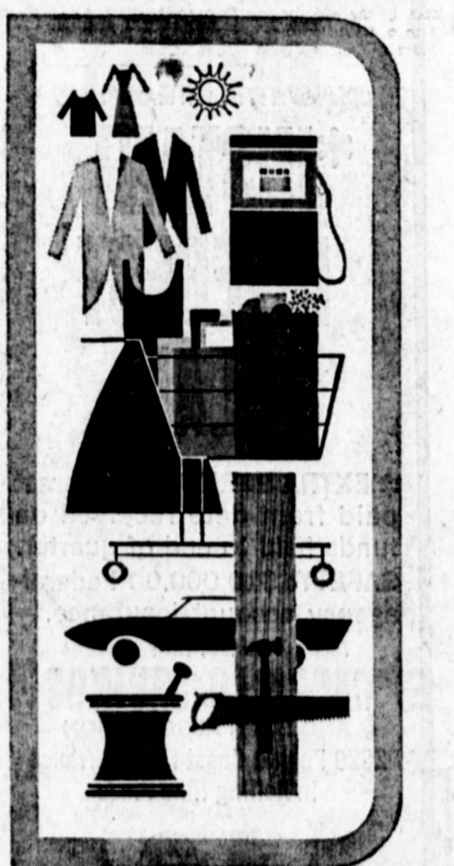
