

# Legislator Reviews Writers' Comments

The legislature convened Wednesday, at 10 a. m., to resume work on the budget and to vote on any bills resulting from one or more Special Sessions called by the governor to run concurrently with the 1962 Budget Session.

Since Jan. 1, I have been attempting to analyze my mail from people in Venice, Playa del Rey, Westchester (Los Angeles 45), El Segundo, Manhattan Beach, Hermosa Beach, Redondo Beach, Torrance, Palos Verdes Estates, Rolling Hills, Rolling Hills Estates, Portuguese Bend, and the beautiful Santa Catalina Island.

Most people who wrote to me at my permanent mailing address, Post Office Box 327, Redondo Beach, expressed their opinions on more than one subject, but here is the best possible analysis I can make of what they want, presented in the order of the number of definite statements:

1. ELIMINATE communism and its "front" organizations, both in the United States and in foreign countries, by one means or another.
2. Eliminate, or at least

3. Educate our adults and children in the true principles of the American form of government, emphasizing not only our rights but also our responsibilities.
4. Encourage each man and woman to practice the religion of his own choice seven days a week, twenty-four hours per day.
5. Encourage and demand a higher standard of moral conduct, not only in our private lives but especially on the part of public officials, more especially judges.
6. Write to our two U.S. senators and our congressmen, demanding that they and the President of the United States not only make beautiful speeches but practice what they preach by presenting to foreign nations a strong stand in foreign affairs and then back this up, if necessary, with force.
7. STOP THE steady march downhill toward more and more socialism and start climbing up hill to return to the high plateau of the American form of government for which this Republic was founded.

8. Stop all drives for "big government," whether it be "metropolitan government," "regional government," or concentrating too much power in either Sacramento or Washington, D. C. Get back to home rule. Let the cities do what they can. If the cities cannot do a job, let the county do it. If the cities and counties cannot do a job let the state do it, but go to Washington, D.C. with our troubles only if all else fails.
9. Encourage people to read their newspapers, both their home-town papers and the large metropolitan daily newspapers. Television news is more entertaining than informative on most programs.
10. STOP making "politics" an ugly word. Politics is the machinery by means of which we select and elect the people who represent us. Become active in the political party of your choice, but remember that Adlai Stevenson once said: "It will be a sorry day for democracy when we stop looking at the character and qualifications of candidates for public office and look only at the party label."
11. Reduce taxes at all levels. Do not increase taxes, either by a direct vote for tax increase, or for a bond issue which eventually will require increased taxes from you and me.
12. Support the armed forces of the United States. This includes not only the regular forces, but the reserves, and the California National Guard. Encourage men to enlist vol-

untarily. Encourage men and women to take courses in high school and college that help national defense.

13. ENCOURAGE young people to take seriously their responsibilities as citizens by doing their best to learn their lessons in the elementary schools and high schools and treat their teachers with more respect. Without this firm foundation, they will waste their time and the taxpayers' money in college.
14. Explore other people's viewpoints and try to find areas of agreement. Most decent people want the same objectives. Arguments often result from failure to listen to what others are saying. Let our only argument among ourselves be this: "Which one of us can do, will do, and is doing the most for America within the limits of his or her abilities?"
15. Finally, when people discuss atomic warfare, nuclear warfare, fall-out shelters, and the dangers of attack by the enemy abroad, or attack by subversives in our midst, there is an old Negro spiritual song entitled: "There Is No Hiding Place Down Here." This means that our constant prayer should be: "Thy Will Be Done!"
