Community Health Week Events Slated

Gerald A. Heidebreder, M. D. Chief Deputy Health Officer. For the past 17 years, under the sponsorship of the Community Health Assn., official and voluntary health organizations together with private medicine and numerous civic minded citizens have set aside and observed an annual Community Health Week in Los Angeles County. This year the week of March 18-24 has been set for the 18th annual observance of the occasion.

In 1962, for the first time, Community Health Week is being recognized on a statewide basis. During that week official and voluntary health agencies

will hold "Open House" throughout Los Angeles County in a combined effort to acquaint the public with their functions and the health opportunities which they extend to the public.

HEALTH WEEK will officially begin with the ribbon-cutting ceremony on Monday, March 19, that marks the opening of "Health City" in Pershing Square. "Health City" is open to the public without charge and will feature health exhibits and free chest X-rays. During the entire week, one-dollar polio and tetanus clinics will offer visitors an opportunity to be immunized against both tetanus and poliomyelitis. Highlighting the week's activities will be the day-long Conference and the Health

Leadership Luncheon to be held on Wednesday, March 21, in the Biltmore Hotel at 5th and Olive Streets in Los Angeles. Starting at 9:30 a.m., the morning program will consist of two concurrent conference sessions.

ONE SESSION, in the Biltmore Theatre, will feature a discussion of retardation as a childhood disease and educational advancement under the guidance of Robert Shusan, executive director of the Exceptional Children's Foundation. The other conference meets in the Biltmore Ballroom and will feature outstanding speakers on nutrition, dental health, physical fitness and opportunities for senior citizens.

Dr. Morris Grover, Pasadena

City health officer, and Miss Trudys Lawrence of the Los Angeles City Schools, will act as co-chairmen of this symposium on "Total Fitness."

THE HEALTH leadership luncheon in the Biltmore Bowl from 11:30 a.m. to 2 p.m. will follow the morning conference sessions. Dr. John D. Porterfield, deputy surgeon general, U.S. Public Health Service, will be guest speaker. His topic will be "Using Our Total Resources for Total Health." As part of the luncheon program, recognition will be given to representative volunteer workers from throughout Los Angeles County who have devoted their time and efforts to advance the health of the community in which they live.

Blount Lashes Out At Zoning Practice

Favoritism in zoning will end if Willys Blount is elected as mayor, he promised in a statement issued here yesterday. He is studying the possibility of more stringent legislation to end zoning discrimination.

Blount is critical that no standards are followed consistently in granting permission for rezoning and variances, he said. Presently a person's property rights are too often left to the whims of the City Council and Planning Commission, he charges.

"I would favor a comprehensive study by a citizen's committee, preferably a group of men and women who have no axe to grind in real estate," Blount stated. "The duty of the committee would be to study the Torrance zoning laws and report to the council if there is any way of doing a good job for the city and at the same time avoid hurting a taxpayer who may desire to add a room or improve his property in some other manner."

"I'M OPPOSED to hodgepodge construction or development," Blount said, "but I would fight equally hard to prevent favoring one person over another in similar zoning problems."

Blount pointed out that he can see no reason for allowing one person to build in a low drainage area and forbidding a second one the same privilege. He said it is his candid opinion that any type of problem should be corrected before anyone is given a right to build within the city limits of Torrance.

BLOUNT POINTED out there have been instances in which one person was allowed a multiple unit, and the homeowner next door restricted to an R-1 zoning.

Mayorality Candidate Blount believes every resident deserves an even break, provided that break does not jeopardize the health, safety, and welfare of the community.

Torrance Man To Graduate With Honors

Charles F. Power, 1908 Estradero, will be graduated with high distinction from the Pennsylvania State University Sunday. Power, whose major field of study was meteorology, will be among 19 seniors graduated with honors at the Winter Term commencement exercises. Four hundred seniors and nearly 150 graduate students are candidates for degrees.

Of the 19 to be honored, only one is receiving the "highest distinction" recognition, Power and six others will receive "high distinction" honors, and the other 11 are being graduated "with distinction," school officials reported.
