

Minister Opens Series On 'Creative Skeptics'

"Creative Skeptics," a series of sermons by Richard Seebode, minister of Pacific Unitarian Church, began Sunday, March 11, with "Skeptics and Heretics."

Know Your Traffic Laws

Each year many complaints are received by the police department from parents as well as from the Board of Education regarding drivers failing to stop for the school buses as they are discharging passengers while flashing red lights are being displayed.

Certainly this is a matter of great concern to all drivers of school buses as the responsibility of the safety of the passengers is theirs. As one driver pointed out, "We do all we can to train the children but their safety is in the hands of our drivers. It is a miracle we have not had some serious

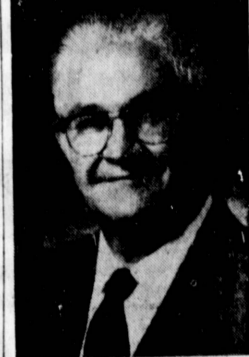
injuries thus far because of drivers failing to stop for the flashing red lights which are always displayed as we discharge our passengers."

Section 22454 of the California Vehicle Code describes what a driver does as his vehicle approaches a school bus displaying flashing red lights:

"THE DRIVER of any vehicle upon meeting or overtaking from either direction any school bus equipped with signs as required in this code which has stopped for the purpose of receiving or discharging any school children and displays a flashing red light signal visible from front and rear shall bring such vehicle to a stop immediately before passing the school bus and shall not proceed past the school bus until the red flashing light ceases operation."

The above does not apply to any driver if the roadway is divided and is two separate roadways or if the school bus is stopped at an intersection or place where traffic is controlled by a traffic officer or official traffic control signal.

CONSIDERING our safety and accident record regarding school children in Torrance, we must give our Board of Education and its employees a great deal of credit for the record they help set. They have done an outstanding job of educating our children in matters of safety so it is up to each of us as drivers to do our share. Not only must we yield to school buses displaying flashing red lights but must use extreme caution anytime we have occasion to be driving in the area of a school.
