Horton has objected to a death by bow and arrow, so in the final drama this spring, Flint McCullough will ride out into the sunset to seek revenge against some blackquard who had offended him earlier in the series.



The mystery of his disappearance will be far more confusing to them. People die every day. Nice people, rich people, poor people, friends and neighbors and members of one's family. I have a hunch the kids in the audience can take this kind of news better than the producer.
