

Teachers Institute On Communism Set

Plans for an Institute on Communism for Teachers and School Administrators, to be held for six weeks this summer at the University of Southern California, were announced yesterday by Dr. Roger Swearingen, director of USC's Research Institute on Communist Strategy and Propaganda.

Nearly 100 high school teachers, junior college instructors, and school administrators will be enrolled in the Institute, generally regarded as the most substantial and significant effort of its kind in America to date.

DESIGNED TO aid teachers and administrators in formulat-

ing their own courses of study on the subject of communism, the Institute will include four courses, a lecture series on Communist doctrine, a teachers' seminar-workshop and a series of Evening Forums on Communism, which will be open to the public.

Scheduled to begin June 25 and run through Aug. 3, the Institute on Communism will be a part of USC's regular Summer Session. It will have strong support from USC's Schools of Education and International Relations and from its science and economics departments.

Faculty for the Institute and speakers for the lecture series and the Evening Forums will

be drawn from USC's own faculty, the staff of the Research Institute on Communist Strategy and Propaganda, and from such distinguished American universities as Notre Dame, Columbia, and Stanford.

Those enrolled in the Institute, inquiries concerning which already have come from widespread parts of the country, must be prepared for some hard work, Dr. Swearingen has warned.

EACH PERSON enrolled will be expected to take at least two of the four core courses: Soviet Russia in World Politics, Seminar in Soviet Foreign Policy, Government of Russia, and Soviet Economic Develop-

ment. Once each week they will be expected to attend sessions of the lecture series on Communist Doctrine: Marxism, Leninism, Stalinism, Khrushchevism, Titoism, and Maoism.

In the seminar-workshop, material from the core courses and the lecture series will be evaluated, integrated, and prepared for purposes of presentation as study units on the high school and junior college level. The workshop, under the direction of Dr. William Georgiades, associate professor of education at USC, will be concerned, with the selection of bibliography, with curriculum development and the entire broad range of problems related to developing study units.

Owners of Cal-Vet Homes Asked to Check Insurance

Cal-Vet home owners are protected against fire and a number of other hazards by an insurance policy issued under a contract negotiated between the insurer and the Department of Veterans, but not every hazard is covered, Mrs. Sara R. Bridges, Torrance veterans service officer, pointed out recently.

"The insurance policy which each Cal-Vet borrower receives, lists the actual risks that the policy covers," Mrs. Bridges explained. "However, it should be noted that these policies only insure the actual home or dwelling, and do not cover losses incurred through fire or other hazards to personal property.

"We feel the home owner should be aware of this so that if he desires he may take additional insurance to cover his personal belongings."

This list is not all-inclusive and it would be wise for the policy holder to read his policy carefully to know exactly what is covered.

However, the policy specifically states that personal property is not covered.

THIS means that a fire could destroy or damage such personal belongings as furs, jewelry, clothing and furniture in the home and they would not be insured.


Home-owners policies covering these risks, or separate fire or burglary insurance policies, may be obtained to give the protection necessary.

These policies may be obtained through any broker or agent the veteran desires.

It is stressed that the Farm and Home Purchases Division of the Department of Veterans Affairs does not endorse or recommend any specific personal property policy, nor is the department concerned with the writing of such policies or adjustment of losses under them.






