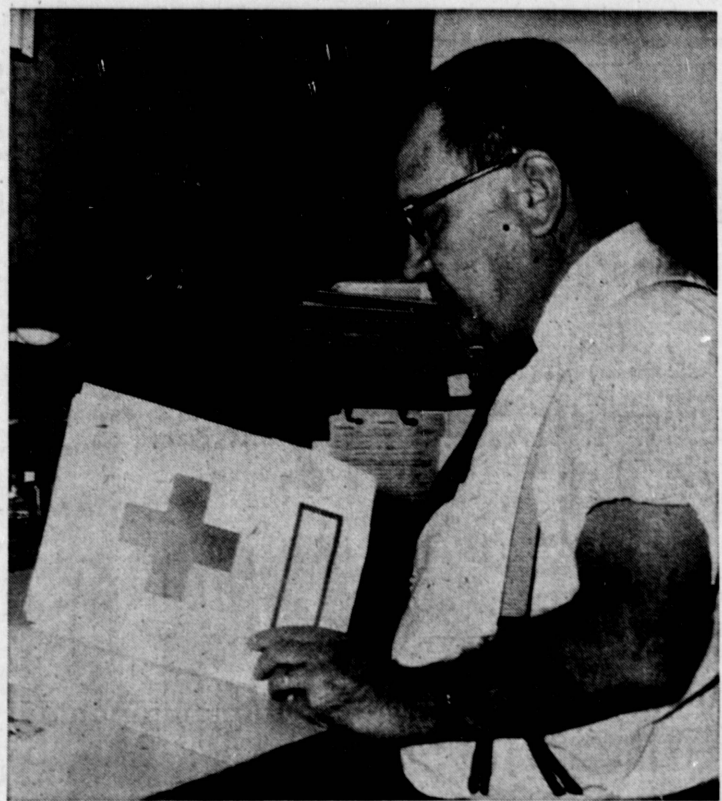

'Bob' Lewellen Optimistic of Red Cross Campaign Success

A methodically determined Torrance civic leader born on a military post and taught to value good organization, Robert L. 'Bob' Lewellen, serving as 1962 Red Cross Torrance business chairman, is rapidly acquiring a reputation for 'being tops' as a community leader.

'I enjoy working for Red Cross. I saw their people in action during my days of service in World War II,' declared Lewellen.

After distributing all known assignments to his committee of fund raisers, Lewellen and his assistant co-chairman Jackie Pagac scouted around until they came up with the names of 121 new businesses in the Torrance area.

'This is what I'm counting on to put us ahead,' said Lewellen, who claims he will never take a job unless he can be sure of handling it 100 per cent 'or better.'

A RESIDENT OF Torrance since 1924, Lewellen was a printing foreman at the Torrance HERALD for 24 years. He has owned his own commercial printing plant at 1706 Oak St. since 1949.

One 'Lewellen innovation' to Torrance fund raising has been a plan of asking three medical men to assist with con-

tributions from their colleagues. Dr. Eugene Cook, M.D.; Dr. Robert Bingham, dentist; and Dr. Theodore C. Buzanis, D.O., are all assisting with the current campaign.

Lewellen is a lieutenant colonel in the National Guard Reserve, secretary of the Torrance Rotary, and a past coordinator for the Torrance Armed Forces Day. He is a member of the Elks Lodge, Redondo Beach, and a member at large and assistant advancement chairman of the Harbor Area Boy Scouts. His only previous volunteer campaign work was for the YMCA.

Little Company of Mary Receives Accreditation

Little Company of Mary Hospital announced Friday that it has just received full three-year accreditation by the Joint Commission on Accreditation of Hospitals.

Mother M. Patricia, hospital administrator, reported that the hospital was inspected by the Joint Commission on Jan. 22, and that the notification has been received that full approval has been granted.

'We feel very pleased,' Mother Patricia stated, 'that full three-year approval has been granted as a result of our first inspection. Equally gratifying is the fact that this has been achieved after only two years of operation. When we first contacted the Joint Commission in June of 1960, we were notified that there would

be an 18-month wait for inspection due to the large number of hospital applying for accreditation. Consequently, we feel very fortunate to have achieved this distinction when the hospital is only two years old.'

The Joint Commission on Accreditation of Hospitals is a voluntary, non-profit organization supported by the American College of Surgeons, the American Hospital Assn., the American Medical Assn., and the Canadian Medical Assn.

Pioneer in Electronic Field Joins Local Firm

Sol Heytow, widely recognized as a leading inventor and pioneer in the electronic organ industry, has been appointed director of research and development of Estey Electronics, Inc.

One of the first to use transistors in organs, Heytow holds many patents in the field, several of which are the basis of some of the country's leading

a youngster, Heytow began building crystal radio sets and other electronic equipment at the age of 8. When he was 12 he was servicing radios, and he had an amateur radio license by the time he was 13.

brands of electronic organs. From 1956 until recently, Heytow was chief engineer of the Thomas Organ Co.

In 1946 when electronic transistors were priced at \$25 each, Heytow founded Haygen Organ Co., which designed and sold custom-built transistorized electronic church organs, ranging in price from \$5,400 to \$25,000.

HE STARTED HIS career in 1941 when he joined Doolittle Radio in Chicago as senior engineer, immediately after graduating from Armour Institute and RCA Institute with a degree in electrical engineering.
