### Motorist Selling Auto Can End Ticket Woes

Many California motorists are receiving other people's violation "tickets" because they overlook a Vehicle Code statute enacted to protect them from exactly this nuisance.

Tom Bright, director of motor vehicles, called attention of car owners and particularly of those who are selling or planning to sell their cars, to Section 5900 of the Code, which has been on the statute books since 1936.

It reads in part: "Whenever the owner of a vehicle sells or transfers the vehicle to another, the owner shall immediately notify the department (of motor vehicles) of the sale or transfer giving the date thereof, the name and address of the owner and of the transferee and such description of the vehicle as may be required in the appropriate form provided for such purpose by the department."

"THE MOTORIST who sells his car and notifies the depart-

ment as required by this Vehicle Code law," Bright commented, "will not receive citations traced through incorrect registration and license plate records. Forms to give the notice required are available from every field office of the Department of Motor Vehicles. "Nobody wants to send an incorrect citation form after an accident or violation. But if the seller of a vehicle does not notify the official state record-keeper that the ownership has been changed, the police will be guided by the out-of-date record, and the tickets will come to an innocent party.

"The legislature felt strongly enough about the matter of public security involved here to classify failure to give the appropriate notice as a misdemeanor," Bright added. "This means that the motorist who fails to notify DMV will not only receive any tickets earned by the buyer, but is himself breaking the law by allowing the vehicle registration to remain uncorrected."

### Supervisors Given Five Fallout Shelter Plans

"The County of Los Angeles is the only governmental agency, including the federal government, which has worked out in every detail a shelter program for its population," Supervisor Kenneth Hahn said yesterday.

He referred to the County Engineer's report on five pro-

TOTYPE shelters based on his countywide shelter plan. The report was presented to the Board of Supervisors on Tuesday.

"THIS IS THE first engineering study which specifically designates the type of shelter which can be built, the location of shelters, and the time required to construct them," he said.

"It provides a practical solution to Los Angeles County's shelter needs, outlining the establishment of shelters within 15 minutes walking distance of the majority of the population's homes."

Supervisor Hahn pointed out that shelters will serve a dual purpose under the plan.

SINCE THEY are designed for construction under school yards, the shelter may be used as auxiliary classrooms to meet the continuing shortage of adequate educational facilities in Southern California.

"This report proves that local government can do a job effectively, economically and quickly if given the authority," Supervisor Hahn said.

"I COMMEND County Engineer John Lambie and Roy Hoover, director coordinator of disaster services for the county, for preparing the finest report in existence concerning fallout shelters.

"Nothing we have received from Washington, D.C. matches this report," he concluded.

The five prototype shelter sites included in the report are at Southwest Sportsman's Park, Hollywood High School, Dana Junior High School in Arcadia, Birney Elementary School in Long Beach and Antelope Valley Junior College, Lancaster.
