Mrs. Clawson Seeking a Better City

As the mother of a teenaged boy and an effervescent daughter, Jean Clawson is anxious to add the voice of a concerned parent to the City Council, she said this week.

"I am concerned about the atmosphere our city provides for youngsters and about the facilities that are needed to provide a wholesome life for all Torrance children."

Strong family ties and a desire to see that her children and those of others have a proper community environment are among the compelling reasons which have put the charming businesswoman and housewife in the race.

"There are many key decisions to be made regarding the welfare of children in the next few years by our city government. More than 50 per cent of the city residents in Torrance are below the age of 21, thus our city needs leaders who understand young people and who can respond to their needs."

SINCE SHE has demonstrated this concern over the years through participation in local youth agencies, Mrs. Clawson feels qualified to add this dimension to the City Council.

Among the projects with which she has worked are the YWCA, Teen Canteen, American Field Service, Torrance Area Youth Band, and the recently completed Torrance Scout Center.

She is a member of the Pony League Auxiliary, the YMCA Century Club, and is the only woman serving on the board of managers of the Torrance YMCA.

IN ADDITION to her part in organized work, and to the experience she, like others, has gained as a parent to growing youngsters, Mrs. Clawson brings 10 years of experience from industry where she was employed by Mobil Oil Co. During the past four years, she has been operating her own successful business in Torrance.

As a businesswoman in Torrance she is aware of the need for proper zoning and balance in order to maintain lower taxes and to insure progress for the city, she has stated.

"I have always been and will continue to be active in numerous committees and organizations in Torrance, including the membership committee of the Chamber of Commerce, the Torrance Woman's Club, Business and Professional Woman's Club, Torrance Traffic Safety Council, and as administrator for the Southwest District of the Los Angeles County Medical Assn.

"I FEEL that I have a deep understanding of the problems that are confronting our city at this time, and have a working knowledge of how these problems can be solved," she said.

"With proper balance, we will maintain low taxes and provide the best city services of police and fire protection and we can develop a cultural growth to benefit every citizen. At the same time, we can include in our youth program facilities that will create the best moral, cultural, and recreational environment for our growing youth."

Local Firm To Work on Rocket Part

In what is a major development in the U.S. race to the moon, the Tylan Corp. of Torrance has been selected by the National Aeronautics and Space Administration to develop a ground check-out power supply system for the Saturn moon rocket.

The 10-story Saturn booster vehicle, now under construction at the Marshall Space Flight Center in Huntsville, Ala., weighs over a million pounds. It is scheduled to be operational in 1964 for sending the three-man Apollo spacecraft to the moon and to boost a space station into orbit around the earth.

According to Tylan officials Charles Drexel and Dan LeMay, the Tylan power supply furnishes precise direct current to check out portions of the electrical equipment in the booster. Performance, size and reliability were key factors influencing the selection.
