Get Best Seat Belts, CHP Warns

When it comes to installing seat belts in the family auto, "be sure you know what you're buying." That's a word of advice from the California Highway Patrol.

Belts must be strong enough to withstand tremendous impact if they are to save lives and prevent serious injuries in traffic accidents.

Supervising Inspector Russ Fuson, Commander of the CHP's Los Angeles area, points out that many California mo-

torists are buying seat belt installations that haven't been tested and approved by the Highway Patrol, as required by the Vehicle Code.

"WHEN BUYING a seat belt, motorists should make sure that each half of the belt is plainly marked with an approved specification number. This applies to belt buckle and bracket mountings as well," the Inspector says.

Most auto companies supply seat belts in a variety of colors and varying prices. So choosing the right installation will not be a problem if the buyer insists on an approved seat belt that measures up to the Patrol's safety standards.

Information concerning approved seat belt installations for sale in California can be obtained at the nearest Highway Patrol office, he points out.
