Throwing 6 1/3 innings of no-hit ball, Torrance mound Don Coil watched his perfect game go down in a blaze of wildness and errors as the Tartars dropped a crucial 5 to 4 extra-inning decision to Pioneer League foe Aviation on Tuesday.

Pitching beautifully, and seemingly well on his way to a no-hitter, Coil suddenly slipped and so did Torrance's 4-0 lead in the fatal sixth.

First Coil walked Rick Tibbles, then an error by left-fielder Gary Hayworth, a J. V. protegee, allowed Ron Lloyd to reach first base. Then the thunder broke loose as Joe Burton tripled to left center, bringing across a pair of runs.

It was the first loss versus a single win for Torrance against league foes, and set them up for today's crucial contest against El Segundo, CIF runner-up last year, on the Torrance Park diamond.

Coil wound up whiffing seven men, walking seven and giving up two hits. His replacement, John Cambon, took over after 6 1/3 innings and struck

out two men while giving up three free passes and one hit. Cambon also gave up the free pass in the eighth frame which allowed Aviation to walk away with the contest.

For Aviation, George Lloyd went all the way on the mound, walking six and sending five Tartars down swinging.

Cambon, playing in his first league game, popped out a pair

of singles in four trips to the dish. Irv Palica took top hitting honors for Torrance, clubbing out two hits in three times at bat, including one double.

Palica is now hitting the apple at a .750 clip after two league contests, including two doubles and a single in four

times at bat. He has walked three times.

Torrance boasts a 1-1 mark going into today's battle, winning a decision against Beverly Hills and dropping the crucial contest to loop contender Aviation.
