

Kinyon Reveals New Plant Assignments

W. Kenneth Scott has been appointed superintendent of engineering and maintenance of the Torrance Works of U. S. Steel's Columbia-Geneva Division, it was announced yesterday by E. C. Kinyon, general superintendent.

Scott was transferred from the division's San Francisco headquarters where he had been assistant chief engineer-

design and consulting since 1959. He succeeds Ray W. Pett, Torrance Works superintendent of engineering and maintenance since 1959.

In one of three lateral transfers simultaneously announced by Kinyon, Pett was named superintendent of rolling mill. He succeeds William M. Montgomery who moves to superintendent of open hearth, replacing Robert J. Prout.

PROUT HAS been appointed assistant to the general superintendent, a new position at the Torrance Works.

Scott brings to the Torrance Works 40 years' experience in the steel industry. He began his career with the Otis Steel Co. plate mill, Cleveland, Ohio. Two years later he joined the former Columbia Steel Co. as a crane operator in the Pittsburgh Works.

By 1939 he was electrical supervisor on major development projects at Pittsburgh, and shortly thereafter became maintenance superintendent of the Pittsburgh Defense Foundry.

HE WAS assistant superintendent on the construction of modern new sheet and tin

plate facilities at Pittsburgh Works following World War II.

Scott was chief electrical engineer for Columbia Steel Co. from 1948 until his appointment as staff engineer for the newly formed Columbia-Geneva Division four years later. In 1956 he became supervisor-staff engineer for both steel producing and mining operations for the division and Columbia Mining Co.

A native of Pomeroy, Pa., he received his academic education at the University of California Extension, and is a registered professional engineer in California and Utah.

HE IS a member of the Mining and Metal Industry Committee and Industrial Power Systems Committee of the American Institute of Electrical Engineers. He holds memberships in the National Society of Professional Engineers, Assn. of Iron and Steel Engineers, and the Engineers Club of San Francisco.

Before coming to the Torrance Works as superintendent of maintenance and engineering, Pett had been superintendent of U. S. Steel's Keigley Quarry, Payson, Utah, since

1953. He joined U. S. Steel's Geneva Works in 1947 as a construction engineer, following graduation from the University of Wisconsin with a B.S. degree in civil engineering. He and his wife, Darlene, and their four children live at 28507 Robin View Lane, Rolling Hills.

A GRADUATE of the U. S. Naval Academy where he received his B. S. in electrical engineering, Montgomery joined the Torrance Works in 1947 as industrial engineer, following separation from the U.S. Navy as a lieutenant commander after six years service. He served the Torrance Works successively as assistant superintendent of maintenance and utilities, assistant superintendent of open hearth, and superintendent of open hearth.

He and his wife, Constance, and two sons live at 2701 Gramercy, Torrance.

PROUT JOINED U. S. Steel's Gary Works in 1938, after receiving his B.S. degree in metallurgical engineering from Michigan Tech. He served in various capacities at the Indiana steel mill until 1946 when he was named super-
