Lions Strip Lures Jet-Powered Bomb

World famous race driver, speed is the second fastest Art Arfons of Akron, Ohio is ever attained by an American, scheduled to appear with his huge jet-powered dragster Sat-urday night at Lions Drag Strip in Long Beach. The jet is scheduled to make

urday night at Lions Drag Strip in Long Beach. This car, which is no more than a J-47 Panther jet engine on wheels, is the same as Art's brother Walt roared to a speed of 230 mph. in 7.36 seconds last year. Two parachutes are used to stop "Cyclops" as the car is called, and in order to reach the 200 mph, mark it is neces-sary to lock the brakes until such terrific thrust is built up that the entire car shakes. Arfons is best known for his 303 mph, run across the Bonne-

303 mph. run across the Bonne ville Salt Flats in the Allison powered streamliner. The trials start at 3:30 in the afternoon, with elimina-tions at 7:30 in the evening.
