Within a matter of weeks, the American Telephone and Telegraph Company will launch the first of two ex-perimental satellites designed to relay television signals be-tween here and Europe. The launching will take place at Cape Canaveral under the auspices of the National Aeronautics and Space Administra-tion, but with the costs being paid by AT&T.

PLANS ARE already afoot for the development of at least a few experimental pro grams.

The instrument that is open-ing up this new horizon in television service is a sphere approximately 3 feet in diameter, weighing but 125 pounds. Within it will be a miniature within it will be a miniature transmitter and receiver, operating with 3½ watts of power supplied by solar cells. This satellite, called Telstar, will orbit the earth at a height of between 600 and 3,000 miles, picking up U.S. signals from the AT&T ground station. from the AT&T ground station in Andover, Me., and trans-mitting them back to earth in

The United States Information Agency, headed by Ed-ward R. Murrow, has been charged with the responsibil-ity for the content of the first satellite telecasts, and meet-ings have already been held with network executives.

THE FIRST telecasts will be cooperatively produced by the three American networks, offi-European Broadcast Union in Seville, Spain, to develop spe-cific plans for the exchange of live programs.
