Guests were Mmes. Bob Lopez, Dick Turner, Newton Metlesel, Ray Stein and Gary Smith.

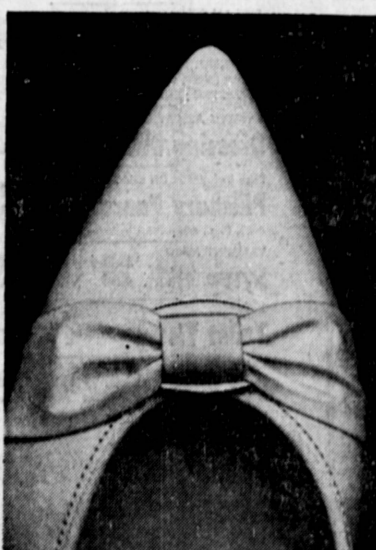
