## New Bank Started In Center

Ground was broken Friday for a large permanent branch office for Citizens National Bank in the Rolling Hills Plaza Shopping Center at Pacific Coast Highway and Crenshaw.

The new banking quarters will replace Citizens temporary office in the shopping center opened in September 1961 to serve the area's immediate banking needs until permanent quarters could be constructed.

Citizens new single-story building with mezzanine will contain 6,000 square feet of operating space and will have a masonry and glass exterior. Lindsey & Lindsey is the contemporary building's designer; Jefferson, Inc., is the leasing agent, and Albert Levitt and James S. Bower are the developers of the Center.

Scheduled to open late this summer, the new Citizens office will offer customers every modern banking facility and service including safe deposit, a night depository, and ample customer parking areas.
