

Invited to Show Works

The Palms Verdes Community Arts Assn., announces its second juried award exhibition for artists resident in the Torrance South Bay, Peninsula, and Harbor areas. The show, which will continue during the month of May, will open with a reception tea from 3 to 5 p.m. on Sunday May 6 at the Library-Gallery, 2400 V.I.A. Campesina. Thereafter, gallery hours daily from 2 to 5 p.m.

As no individual notices to artists will be sent out this year, those wishing to participate are being urged to deliver their work to the Gallery on Tuesday, May 1 from 2 to 5 p.m. or Wednesday, May 2 from 2 to 5 and 7 to 9 p.m. Pick up for rejected paintings will be Tuesday, May 8 from 2 to 5 and 7 to 9 p.m. Accepted paintings to be picked up Friday, June 1 from 2 to 5 and 7 to 9.

Entries will be limited to one painting per artist in oil, watercolor, or mixed media and must have been painted during 1961-1962. Works should be framed and ready for hanging, size not to exceed 3 by 5 feet. Identification labels will be filled out at time of delivery. Entry fee is 50 cents. All work to be insured while on the premises for the artist's indicated sales price. Approximately 35 paintings will be selected by the jurors, Frederick Black of Long Beach State College, and Anders Anderson of Otis Art Institute, who will adjudicate the entries for quality.

The Administration was charged today by U. S. Sen. Thomas H. Kuchel of California with unsound policies that present the risk of "digging graves for our newspapers and magazines" in seeking to impose sharp increases in certain categories of postal rates.

In a speech for delivery in the senate, the assistant Republican leader hit at the "maze of all this confusion" and warned the rate measure approved by the house could be the most adverse legislation in recent years. Voicing fear of the effect on the free press, Kuchel commended the chairman and ranking Republican member of the Senate Post Office Committee, Sens. Olin Johnson of South Carolina and Frank Carlson of Kansas, for making an exhaustive review of the proposed scales.

THE SENIOR California senator said that in seeking a balanced postal system budget the Executive Branch not only is threatening to bankrupt some of the nation's most respected publications but assailing a significant \$20 billion-a-year mail order business. Commenting that he has

been "hearing from many constituents who will be placed in an economic strait-jacket," Kuchel noted that second class rates have jumped 39 per cent and third class charges 150 per cent in the last decade. He protested that the Post Office Department puts publishers on "the economic scaffold every time the subject of increased postal revenue comes before the congress."

THE CALIFORNIA lawmaker said great difficulty is experienced in making proper postal policy because of disagreement about public services. The Executive Branch has charged amounts ranging from \$49,000,000 to \$343,000,000 for such non-postal service and then cut the figure back to \$248,000,000, he pointed out. The department was particularly criticized for eliminating from its computations thousands of small post offices determined to be public services in the 1953 Postal Policy Act. Referring to a recent published statement of Postmaster General Day on cost ascertainment, Kuchel questioned the results produced by methods employed by departmental officials. He expressed doubt particularly about alleged losses on second class and third class business.

WITH A protest the Administration proposal greatly exceeds "bearable levels," the assistant Republican leader pointed to the serious financial plight of several specific magazines and publishers and asserted many smaller daily and weekly newspapers, both in California and other sections, are in precarious position as reported by the National Editorial Assn.

Saying he normally does not comment on legislation while

under committee study, Kuchel declared:

"The postage rate bill sponsored by this Administration and by the Post Office Department is ill-advised as a revenue measure because it may yield less revenue, not more. As a matter of public policy, this result is more unfortunate."

"IT SEEMS to me that it is about time for the political bureaucrats of the Post Office to become a little more realistic about postal costs and postal charges. Five years ago, under congressional impetus, an advisory committee of distinguished citizens was appointed to study this whole problem. The report of this committee is still the finest study ever made on the complex business of rate-making in relation to public policy. This committee strongly upheld the theory that the Post Office Department is primarily a public service institution and not a business, and that it has been so considered since our nation was founded. . . . The Post Office Department has variously indicated public services amounting to \$49 million, \$341 million, and now it is supporting \$248 million. What is the true figure?"
